**Topics To Be Covered in
the Two-Day Workshop**

May 4 and 5, 2009

- What research tells us about building safe, affirming schools where everyone can learn: presentation and discussion.
- Interventions for individual staff members to use, including effective use of praise, mentoring, limit-setting, class discussions, and ways to address bullying in the moment: presentation and guided skill-practice.
- School-wide interventions, including building staff consensus about expectations; implementing consistent, effective consequences for unacceptable student to student behavior; developing individual behavior plans; collaborating with parents; and working to reduce bullying by staff: presentation, discussion, and guided skill practice.
- Empowering peer bystanders to build positive, inclusive peer cultures using awareness-building, social norms marketing, skill-training, and creation of effective peer action teams: presentation, discussion, and guided skill-practice.
